Medicine studies in Israel, who participated in the “New York” and “Touro” programs

Graduates who completed their medical studies at the Tel Aviv University in the “New York” program and graduates who completed their medical studies at the Technion in the “Touro” program will be eligible for a license to practice medicine in Israel, only after they have successfully passed the government written examination toward medical internship and have successfully completed their period of internship in Israel.

Graduates from these programs who have successfully completed a recognized medical internship abroad, of at least one year, will be eligible to practice medicine in Israel only after they have successfully passed the written government medical examination.

Exempt from the Government Licensing Medical Examination

Graduates who have completed their medical studies in these programmes and who have a specialist degree abroad, whose specialization program abroad was fully recognized by the scientific council of the Israel Medical Union, and were exempted from the internship examinations, and whose eligibility for the specialist degree was approved in Israel as well.

Medicine studies in a 4 year track by St George’s Hospital Medical School, London UK

Medicine studies in a 4 year track are studies combined studies of the University of Nicosia and the Faculty of Medicine of Tel Aviv University (through Sheba Hospital, Tel Hashomer).

Additional required documents

In addition to documents that overseas graduates are required to show, the following documents are also to be attached:

1. An undergraduate degree or previous studies based on which the applicant was admitted to the 4 year program.
2. A diploma (including appendix to diploma), or a confirmation of eligibility for a degree from the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine at St George’s Hospital Medical School, London UK.
3. Confirmation of finishing two years of preclinical studies at Nicosia from the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine in Nicosia (including a breakdown of the various courses taught).
4. A confirmation signed by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine at Tel Aviv University, concerning the order of clinical studies at Sheba, Tel Hashomer, including a breakdown of the departments in which studies were held during that period (students studying within this track in another country are to show a confirmation signed by the dean responsible in that country accordingly).
