These sources, including the UK Government (i.e. Government of the country where the BMJ is based, and where the authors reside), have stated that Hamas is a proscribed terrorist group. Please revise the article accordingly.

It is essential that the BMJ labels terrorism and terrorist organisations appropriately when they are mentioned in the Journal. The BMJ has, to its credit, a track record of calling out terrorism when it occurs. In this instance, however, this seems to have slipped through the net. The BMJ has a Journalistic and moral duty not to underplay the magnitude and depravity of terrorist acts and mislabel terrorist groups. This is one step short of supporting these groups. It is illegal to support a terrorist organisation in the UK.

I trust that the BMJ will play its role in maintaining the definition of terrorism.
