Subject: <u>Urgent Call to Acknowledge the Murder of Carmel Gat, Healthcare Professional Taken</u>

<u>Hostage, and Advocate for Release of All Hostages Held in Gaza</u>

Dear Ms. Spoljaric Egger and Dr. Adhanom Ghebreyesus and Ms. Shann,

We are writing with deep sorrow and urgency following the brutal murder of Carmel Gat, a 40-year-old occupational therapist, who was executed while held captive by Hamas in Gaza. Carmel was taken hostage on October 7, 2023, during a visit to her parents' home in Kibbutz Be'eri. On September 1, 2024, her body was recovered from a Hamas tunnel in Rafah, alongside five other hostages who were also executed by their captors.

Carmel was a dedicated healthcare professional specializing in mental health and was pursuing a master's degree at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Known for her empathy, peacefulness, and professionalism, she was a caregiver who helped two children endure their ordeal by practicing yoga and meditation daily while in captivity.

The release of a psychological terror video by Hamas showing the final statements of Carmel Gat and Alexander Lobanov stands as another testament to Hamas's cruelty and disregard for human life. In the video, both hostages described the harsh conditions of their captivity and pleaded with the Israeli public to pressure their government to negotiate for their release. Notably, Noam, a 17-year-old







released hostage whom Carmel cared for during captivity, expressed his gratitude with the words: "Thank you for taking care of me; because of you, I am here."

This loss not only represents a profound tragedy for her family and colleagues but also highlights crimes against healthcare teams and hostages. These actions flagrantly disregard the fundamental tenets of International Humanitarian Law, which mandates the protection of civilians, non-combatants, the wounded, the sick, healthcare workers, volunteers, and the general civilian population.

We urge the World Health Organization, the International Committee of the Red Cross, and all health organizations to publicly acknowledge and condemn the cruel murder of Carmel Gat and the other hostages. Immediate action is needed to protect all hostages and healthcare workers still held captive, including Keith Segal, an American-Israeli occupational therapist. Additionally, Lior Rudaeff, an emergency medical technician and dedicated MDA volunteer ambulance driver for 40 years, was murdered on October 7, 2023, and his body was kidnapped to Gaza. Bar Kuperstein, a volunteer medic, remained on site to assist the wounded after the attack until he was kidnapped by Hamas.

We call on your organizations to advocate for the release of all hostages and to treat this atrocity with the same gravity applied to all violations against healthcare workers in conflict zones.
